SIX FIREFIGHTERS/ THIRD AMBULANCE

In late 2006, the City Council approved the hiring of six (6) additional firefighters at mid-year 2007. Due to their commitment to improve the level of service provided by the fire department, this hiring enabled the fire department to increase its daily staffing by two (2) personnel. These personnel were placed into full service in November of 2007 allowing the third ambulance to be placed in service. With the addition of the third ambulance a reduction in reliance on other communities is expected.

FACILITIES

A replacement self-contained breathing apparatus bottle fill station was purchased and installed at Fire Station 1. The new unit replaced a 30 year old unit that could no longer be repaired.

FD RECEIVES GRANT



In January 2007, the Fireman's Fund Insurance Company provided a grant totaling \$5,380 to purchase a public education tool. This money was utilized to purchase the now famous "Pluggie." Pluggie is a remote controlled fire hydrant that delivers a valuable fire safety message to elementary school aged children.

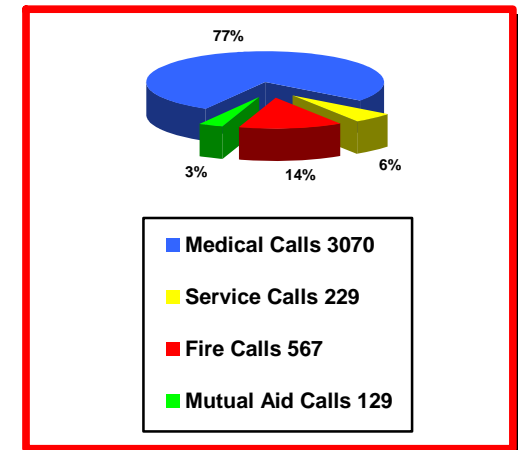

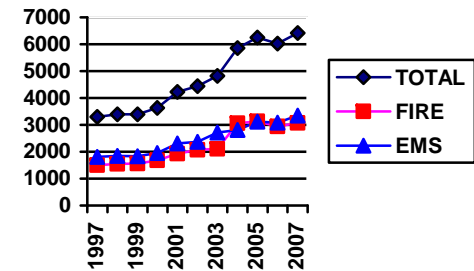
